LITTLE BOY WITH BIG HEART DONATES BIRTHDAY GIFTS TO ANIMALS IN NEED

Not many kids would think of using their birthday as a way to help wild animals in need.

But animal-lover Alexander White did not think twice before requesting that instead of bringing presents to his 7th birthday party on March 22, 2014, friends and family bring donations from the Amazon.com Wish List of Nature's Nursery Center for Wildlife Rehabilitation and Conservation Education.

Nature's Nursery is a non-profit organization located in Whitehouse, Ohio that provides medical care to injured and orphaned wild animals. They also conduct nature education programs for children and adults in order to fulfill their mission of improving the well-being

of Northwest Ohio wildlife populations and habitat through public education and rehabilitation of injured, ailing, and orphaned wildlife.

Alexander collected 25 items and an Amazon gift card for the sick and wounded birds and animals, which include a bald eagle, fox, and turtle. News station 13 ABC was so impressed with the first grader's generosity that they captured on video his birthday visit to the Nursery and aired it on their nightly broadcast. "I knew Nature's Nursery couldn't keep all of the animals alive without all the supplies, so I thought maybe it's a good idea to give Nature's Nursery some help by giving them some supplies," Alexander told the station.

Nature's Nursery Executive Director Candee Ellsworth called Alexander's donation "simply amazing."

Alexander's passion for animals started at a young age. "Ever since Alexander was three, he wanted to be a paleontologist," Mom Cindy White said. "His most recent aspiration is to be a marine biologist. He simply loves animals and wanted to help them on his birthday."



RECIPE: Ian's Insanely-Delicious Homemade Sloppy Joes

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 Tablespoon olive oil
- 2 pounds ground beef
- 1 small Vidalia onion
- 1 Tablespoon Montreal steak seasoning
- 1 red bell pepper
- 1 yellow pepper
- 1 orange pepper
- 1 ½ to 2 cups of ketchup
- 2 Tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 1 Tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- Salt and pepper to taste


INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Sprinkle beef with steak seasoning and cook until brown; drain fat drippings.
2. Add onions and peppers. Cook for a few minutes, until veggies begin to soften.
3. Add ketchup, brown sugar, and mustard. Stir to combine and simmer for 15 minutes, adding



salt and pepper to taste.

4. Serve on warm hamburger buns that have been buttered and browned on a hot skillet, or try using the Sloppy Joe mix as a dip for Ritz crackers. Yum!

CASES OF INTEREST: MAY 2014

At-Fault Driver Knocks Young Woman's Car Into Building, Causes Fractures & Concussion

Our 19-year-old client was knocked unconscious after being struck by another driver with such force that our client's car was knocked into a building. EMS transported our client to a local hospital where she was diagnosed with multiple fractures in her arm, shoulder, and hand, in addition to a concussion. These types of injuries often result in the need for physical therapy and/or surgery, which may eventually be the case in this situation.

Client's Testosterone Therapy May Have Contributed To His Spinal Cord Infarction

Our firm is investigating the link between our client's spinal cord infarction (stroke within the spinal cord) and his testosterone therapy treatments, after the *Journal of the American Medical Association* released a study linking prescription testosterone drugs to an increased risk of cardiovascular injuries in men. The stroke worsened our client's mobility and contributed to his need for a home health aide to assist in daily activities.

Car Strikes Client Standing on Sidewalk, Causes Serious Shoulder Injury & Time Off Work

Our client was thrown in the air and landed on the hood of the car that struck him while he was standing on the sidewalk. He was taken by ambulance to a local hospital where it was discovered that he had a sprained neck, concussion, knee injury, and a tear in his shoulder that requires continued physical therapy and probable surgery. His shoulder injury has resulted in our client missing four months of work at a job that he has enjoyed for nearly 25 years.
