Intensive Care Stay & Multiple Broken Bones After Car Accident Leave Man In Need Of Legal Help

A near-fatal car accident resulted after a driver ran a stop sign, leaving our client hospitalized in intensive care for over two weeks. He suffered a fractured tailbone, a traumatic brain injury, and 11 broken ribs, causing the need for a lung specialist and surgery. He is still treating with an orthopedic surgeon and faces months of recovery.

Rollover Accident Leaves Man With A Traumatic Brain Injury & Lingering Issues

Our client was pinned in the car he was riding in after it flipped three times. He was lifeflighted to the hospital to treat a traumatic brain injury and concussion that has left him with memory problems and migraines for which he is seeing a neurologist. Since he is still having serious pain in his neck, shoulder, and back two months after the accident, he is seeking treatment with an orthopedic physician.

Client Unable To Work For At Least Six Months After Car Accident Leaves Him With A Broken Hip

A week in the hospital after a serious accident was required after the other driver ran a stop sign, fracturing our client's hip and leaving him unable to bear any weight on his leg. As a driver by trade, he is forced to face at least six months off of work as he recovers from his surgery and teaches himself to walk again.

Gaga's Thanksgiving Tomato Pudding

INGREDIENTS

- 15 oz can tomato puree
- 2 cups light brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 3 cups (9 slices) cubed bread we love to use Kings Hawaiian rolls!
- 2 sticks butter, melted

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Pre-heat oven to 325°F
- 2. Put bread in greased casserole dish.
- 3. In a medium bowl, mix together melted butter, tomato puree, brown sugar, corn starch, and dash of salt.
- 4. Pour all of this over the bread and bake uncovered for 45 min.
