


Missy the Collie Helps Nurse Car Accident Victims Back To Health, Lands New Job As **Volunteer Pet Therapy Dog**



It's not every day that a rescue dog ends up being the one to rescue her owners.

But for Joe and Cecilia Arras, Mistletoe the Collie could not have come into their lives at a better time.

On June 27, 2015, Joe and Cecilia were making the 50 minute drive from their home in Findlay to Willard, Ohio, where they were set to pick up their new collie, Missy (short for "Mistletoe"), from a volunteer with the Northeast Ohio Collie Rescue (NEOCR). They were traveling eastbound on US 224 in Clinton Township when a westbound driver went left of center and struck their Ford F-250 head on, demolishing the truck and causing them to be ambulated to nearby hospitals.

Joe cracked his left hip and Cecilia's lower right leg was shattered, requiring plates, screws, and bone-filler

to repair. They both spent three months at Briar Hill Health Campus, a nursing home for in-patient therapy, and it was another eight weeks after discharge before they were well enough to bring their new dog home. In the five months after the accident, Missy would visit regularly with the help of Betty Hodgson from NEOCR.

"I knew that Missy would be well-cared for by Cecilia, which is why we tried to see her so often," Betty said. "Missy brought her a lot of hope while she was recovering."

"I knew through eye-to-eye contact every time she would visit me in the nursing home that she was my dog," Cecilia said. "Missy helped me through a really rough period. I needed that dog bad. She is just the greatest. She's so smart and easy to train."

The day after Thanksgiving, on November 27, 2015, exactly five months to the day of the accident, Missy went to her forever home with the Arras family.

But Missy's good work hasn't stopped there.

"We take her back to the nursing home once a month," Cecilia said. "That was the home she visited





while we were at Briar and she loves to visit people there. As soon as we make the turn to pull in to Briar Hill, she gets so excited."

The nurses, staff, and residents all love Missy so much that they

asked Cecilia if the collie could be a volunteer therapy dog once a month. The Arras family happily agreed, especially considering that Missy is the Arras' seventh collie and all the dogs before her visited nursing homes throughout the Findlay area.

Jen Fackler, the Life Enrichment Associate at Briar Hill, describes the excitement and love that Missy, Cecilia, and Joe brought to the nursing home.

"Joe and 'C' were fabulous to have here," Jen said. "I know that it's not where they wanted to be, since they were here because of the accident, but they were so much fun. The residents love Missy; they adore having her around. They call to her, they want to feed her. We are excited to have her back.'

It was also Missy that connected Attorney Chuck Boyk to the Arras family when they reached out to Boyk Law after the accident.

"We asked Chuck to come to the nursing home and he came and talked with us," Cecilia said. "He has dogs and horses which I thought was great, since I love them both. I hope we never need another lawyer, but if I do I would call Chuck."



RECIPE: Grandpa Larry's Pork Tenderloin with Apples & Onion

This seasoned roast is light yet flavorful and pairs perfectly with mashed potatoes and the recipe is also included in our 100th Issue eCookbook!

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 pork tenderloin, 2-2.5lbs
- 1 Tablespoon olive oil
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1 large sweet Vidalia onion, sliced
- 2 large Fuji apples, cubed
- 1 Tablespoon butter
- Salt and pepper to taste

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 450° F.
- 2. In separate bowl, mix together garlic powder, cumin, coriander, thyme, and salt.

- Rub the pork with the mixture over both sides of the meat, pressing gently so the seasoning adheres well to the tenderloin.
- 3. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, add the olive oil and the minced garlic and sauté, stirring, for one minute. Put tenderloin in the pan and cook for about 10 minutes, searing each side using tongs to turn the meat. Transfer meat to a roasting pan and bake for 25-30 minutes.
- 4. As the pork roasts, add butter to same pan used to sear pork. Once butter melts, add onions and apples. Cook until soft and caramelized.
- 5. Allow pork to sit for 10 minutes after coming out of the oven. Slice and serve with apples and onions.

Woman Is Wheelchair Bound After T-bone Accident Fractures Leg & Breaks Ribs

Our client was t-boned after another driver failed to stop at a stop sign, causing an open compound fracture in our client's ankle that required two surgeries and hardware implants to repair. In addition to needing 10 stitches in her right knee, she also suffered a traumatic brain injury, blood loss that required transfusions, and two rib fractures. She is facing six months in an inpatient skilled rehab facility since she is still non-weight bearing more than three months after the accident, and will most likely need to undergo multiple additional surgeries.

Employee Is Attacked At Work, Suffers Ruptured Ear Drum & The Need For Shoulder Surgery

Our client needs weeks of physical therapy after surgery was needed to repair a grade five separation of his collarbone. In addition to facial contusions, the trauma to his head caused a ruptured ear drum that could result in hearing loss for which he is seeing an ear, nose, and throat specialist.

Passenger Fractures Back In Rollover Accident Caused By Driver Of His Car

The driver of the car our client was riding in was cited for the accident that caused their truck to veer off the road and into a ditch, leaving our client with a fractured vertebrae and the need for a "turtle brace". We have represented him before, and he is bedridden for several weeks and facing long-term physical therapy.
