There has been recent controversy surrounding the prescription birth control pills Yaz, as the Food and Drug Administration warns Bayer, the maker of Yaz, that their commercials are misleading.

More importantly, women are approaching us with a number of serious health problems and the one thing the women have in common is that have taken the once-daily birth control pills Yaz, Yasmin, or Ocella.

"Our office is handling cases where healthy, nonsmoking women under 35 years of age are suffering blood clots and strokes," Attorney Chuck Boyk said. "We are very afraid that there is something wrong with this medication."



- Myocardial infarction or heart attack.
- Cerebral hemorrhage or bleeding inside the brain.
- Cerebral thrombosis or blood clots in the brain, leading to strokes.
- Thrombophlebitis or blood clots in one or more of your veins.
- Hypertension or high blood pressure.
- Gallbladder disease.
- Hepatic adenomas or benign liver tumors.

While every birth control pill has

its side effects and risk factors, the problem with Yaz, Yasmin, and Ocella is that the side effects are potentially fatal.

Our attorneys urge readers to talk to their doctors if they have experienced any of these symptoms while taking Yaz or any other prescription birth control, regardless of its form.
