RECIPE:

Ben's Baked Chimichangas

Much healthier than the traditional fried version, these chimichangas taste just as good while also being easier to make!

INGREDIENTS

- 6 medium, whole wheat tortillas
- 1 large egg white
- 15oz can refried beans
- 15oz can black beans
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Toppings

- 1 cup shredded lettuce
- 1 medium tomato, chopped
- 2 tablespoons cilantro
- 1/2 cup salsa
- 1/2 cup sour cream

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Beat egg whites in a bowl, set aside
- 2. Add beans to middle of tortilla and sprinkle with cheese
- 3. Fold tortilla. Start with one side and fold up an inch and then fold sides and then add more egg white where you make the last fold 4. Flash-fry chimichangas by placing in a pan with two teaspoons oil on medium-high heat. Heat on both sides for 1 minute until golden brown. Place chimichangas onto a pan covered in foil, seam-side down.
- 5. Bake at 350°F for 12-15 minutes.
- 6. Top with lettuce, tomato, sour cream, salsa, and cilantro. Enjoy!




IVC Filters Causing Serious Welcome Damage To Heart, Lungs

Retrievable IVC (Inferior Vena Cava) filters are small spider-like devices built to catch and dissolve blood clots. They are implanted into the vena cava in patients who are at high risk of pulmonary embolism but cannot take blood thinners. The filter works by trapping or filtering blood clots before they travel to vital organs such as the heart or the lungs and cause serious, even life-threatening injuries. Retrievable IVD filters are designed for short-term use and once a patient's risk for a pulmonary embolism has passed, the device should be promptly retrieved. Unfortunately, a greater than expected number of patients suffer adverse events associated with these devices. Two of the most serious complications occur when the filter comes loose or breaks apart. The device and/or the blood clots it was trapping may be carried to the heart or lungs causing blockage or perforation, where the IVC filter punctures and causes serious damage to the heart, lungs or vena cava.

The device contains struts that expand inside the vein to prevent blood clots from entering the heart, lungs or brain. However, reports indicate that filters have a design defect that can cause them to break apart and migrate through the body. Lawsuits have been filed against manufacturers of IVC filters claiming that the devices are defective and that manufacturers intentionally decided not to disclose the dangers to the public.

Who may have a lawsuit? Anyone who is experiencing complications after having a small device implanted into their vein to treat blood clots.

Between Our Client's Stroke & Within Body, Leaving Her Her Shingles Vaccine

Boyk Law Investigating Link Woman's IVC Filter Migrates **Hospitalized For Over A Month**

What was supposed to be an easy treatment of blood clots turned into a nightmare for one woman after doctors implanted an IVC filter. The filter migrated and eroded in her body, causing the need for the device to be removed. She spent two days in the hospital and another forty days recovering in an in-patient rehab facility before working through two more months of out-patient therapy. A year later our client still faces health

Woman Forced To Undergo Multiple Surgeries After Car Pulls Out In Front Of Her

Our client was transported the hospital after striking a car that pulled out in front of her, causing seven fractures, including three fractured ribs. She had to have multiple surgeries to implant plates and screws in her wrists, suffered bone fractures in each leg, and is still dealing with a frozen shoulder after it was fractured in the accident. While rounds of physical therapy have helped somewhat, our client is still dealing with multiple health issues and faces a long road to recovery.


