

# Update: FDA Test Results Find Cancer-Causing Asbestos in J&J Baby Powder

In October of this year, Johnson & Johnson disclosed that a government test had turned up cancer-causing asbestos in its baby powder. The results led to a recall of tens of thousands of bottles of the product.

It turns out the FDA had contracted with a private Maryland lab to test an unmarked substance for asbestos. After the results determined the product did in fact contain asbestos, it was disclosed that the product was J&J Baby Powder. It also turns out that the lab that performed the tests is run by an expert that J&J has repeatedly hired and used in its defense against claims that there is no cancer-causing asbestos in their talc products.

Despite the test being conducted by its own expert, J&J immediately sought to discredit the test results. J&J commissioned another lab to perform testing on its baby powder. However, that lab disclosed that it also found asbestos in the talc samples J&J supplied. Controversy continued

to develop as the lab has since publicly declared that the talc must have been contaminated by an air-conditioning unit inside its testing room.

The U.S. Justice Department initiated a criminal investigation into whether Johnson & Johnson lied to the public about the possible cancer risks of its talcum powder. The company has a history of perpetuating fraud for profit – requiring it to shell out billions of dollars over the past several years to resolve federal criminal fraud actions against it.

Thousands of lawsuits have been filed against J&J claiming their talc products cause cancer and to date, juries have awarded billions to claimants.

# Recipe Santa's Favorite Festive Cookie Trees

#### **INGREDIENTS**

#### Cookies

- 3/4 c. unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 c. sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 tsp. almond extract
- 2 1/4 c. all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1/4 tsp. kosher salt

#### Frosting

- 1 c. butter
- 4 c. powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 3 tbsp. water or milk
- Green gel icing color
- 3 tbsp. red and white pearl sprinkles
- 18 yellow star sprinkles

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Preheat oven to  $350^{\rm o}$  and line two cookie sheets with parchment.
- 2. Cream butter and sugar together until light and fluffy, 3 to 4 minutes. Mix in egg and vanilla and almond extracts. In a separate bowl, whisk together dry ingredients. Add dry ingredients to wet ingredients and mix until smooth. Dough will be thick.

- 3. Make three sizes of cookie dough balls: 1 teaspoon, 2 teaspoons, and 3 teaspoons. (You should have an even number of each.) Place medium and large cookies on a cookie sheet and press down slightly on each. Bake until center looks mostly cooked, 7 to 8 minutes. Place smallest balls of dough on another cookie sheet and press down slightly. Bake until center looks mostly cooked, 5 to 6 minutes. When cookies are done, remove from oven and let cool 2 to 3 minutes, then transfer to a cookie rack to finish cooling.
- 4. Make frosting: Beat butter until smooth. Add half the powdered sugar and mix until smooth. Add vanilla and 2 tablespoons water and mix until smooth. Add remaining powdered sugar and mix until smooth. Add green gel icing color to frosting and mix until your desired shade of green.
- 5. Assemble cookies: Get one size of each cookie. Fit a piping bag with a medium sized star piping tip (I used Wilton 32) and fill bag with green frosting.
- 6. Pipe a swirl of frosting onto the largest cookie, then add the second medium sized cookie on top. Pipe a swirl of frosting onto the second cookie, then top with the smallest cookie. Pipe a swirl on top of the final cookie and decorate with a star and round ornament sprinkles. Continue building cookie trees, then refrigerate until ready to serve.

## **Cases of Interest: December 2019**

#### Lawsuit Filed Against Southwest Airlines Co. After Its Employee Dumps Woman Out Of Her Wheelchair

After spending Thanksgiving with her family, our client was traveling back to her home in Chicago, Illinois via Southwest Airlines. Due to chronic illnesses, our client suffers balance issues that require use of a wheelchair for long walks, including at places like airports. Upon arriving at John Glenn Columbus International Airport, our client obtained a wheelchair and was transported by airport personnel to the Southwest Airlines gate. During the boarding process, a Southwest Airlines employee approached our client and grabbed her wheelchair from behind to push her from the terminal into the aircraft. The employee began pushing our client at an unreasonably fast pace, despite her pleas for him to slow down. The wheelchair's wobbling wheels became locked up and our client was thrown from the wheelchair, landing hard on her hands and knees, with the wheelchair and the airline employee falling on top of her. After sustaining serious personal injuries, our client filed suit against Southwest Airlines Co., John Glenn Columbus International Airport, and Columbus Regional Airport Authority.

#### Self-Employed Trucker Severely Injured While Helping Crane Operator Unload Bundles of Steel Sheets

On October 22, 2019, our client, a self-employed trucker, hauled a load of steel sheet bundles to a company in Marion, Ohio. The company's employee crane operator directed our client to get on the trailer and assist with unloading the steel sheets. At some time during the unloading, our client informed the crane operator that the lift wasn't all the way under the steel sheets. He told the operator to wait while he inspected further, but the crane operator went ahead and lifted the load, knocking our client off the trailer and causing him to fall approximately five feet to the ground. Our client landed on his left side and had the wind knocked out of him. 911 was called, and our client was taken to the hospital where he was diagnosed with a collapsed lung and fractures to his ribs, clavicle, and back. Our client was hospitalized for two weeks before undergoing a surgery to repair his clavicle and a surgery to repair his fractured ribs which included installation of hardware. After a long hospitalization, he still faces a long road to recovery.

#### Young Female Left Unconscious In Burning Car After Driver Improperly Turns Into Her Path Of Travel

Our client was traveling eastbound on U.S. Route 6 when another driver made an improper left turn directly into her path of travel at the intersection with Interstate 75 southbound. Unable to stop her car, our client smashed head on into the front passenger side of the negligent driver's vehicle. Due to the impact, our client lost consciousness and her vehicle caught fire. Thankfully, a good Samaritan rushed over and pulled our client from her burning vehicle, saving her from an even worse fate. She was then transported via ambulance to the Wood County Hospital. Our client suffered major injuries to her head, neck, chest, back, hip and knees. She will be left with a permanent scar on her forehead along with burn injuries to her head and ears.
