Grandma Steffen's Pear Tart

INGREDIENTS:

Pastry

- 1/2 C butter
- 1/3 C sugar
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 3/4 C flour
- 2/3 C pecans, finely chopped

Filling

- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 1/2 C sugar
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- ripe pears, thinly sliced
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp sugar

INSTRUCTIONS:

Pastry

For pastry dough, cream butter and sugar. Stir in vanilla, flour, and pecans. Press dough into 10" tart pan (greased). Bake at 350° for 15 minutes or until lightly browned.

Filling

For filling, beat cream cheese and sugar.



Add egg and vanilla. Pour into baked crust. Fan sliced pears over the top and dust with cinnamon and sugar.

Place tart pan on cookie sheet and bake at 375° for 25 minutes or until set.

FDA REQUESTS Removal of Zantac from Stores

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced its request for the removal of Zantac products from drugstore shelves.

In its press release, the FDA called for the withdrawal of "all prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) ranitidine drugs from the market immediately." The decision comes as a result of the FDA's ongoing investigation into contamination of the product. The FDA discovered N-Nitrosodimethylamine (NDMA) in Zantac. The chemical is a known carcinogen that is used in research to develop tumors in lab animals.

Consumers taking over-the-counter Zantac are advised to stop taking the medication. For patients taking prescription ranitidine, the FDA advises you should talk to your doctor about other treatment options before stopping.

Our firm is investigating cases for individuals who took Zantac and were later diagnosed with cancer.

MOTORCYCLIST SUFFERS SEVERE Injuries After At-Fault Driver Turns in Front of Him

Our client was operating a motorcycle southbound on Telegraph Road in Toledo, Ohio when another driver traveling northbound on Telegraph Road made a left turn directly into our client's path of travel. Upon impact our client was launched over the top of the at-fault driver's vehicle and lost consciousness due to the impact. The Life Squad came to the scene and transported our client to St. Vincent Hospital Emergency Department. Our client remained unconscious and in the hospital for two days. He suffered a fractured skull, a broken nose, six broken toes, black eyes and extensive bruising. Our client has a long road to recovery and will require extensive medical treatment.

ELDERLY WOMAN PASSES AWAY After Falling at Hospital and Suffering brain bleed

An elderly woman was taken to the hospital due to low blood pressure. She was very weak, was deemed a fall risk, and was required to have a two-person-assist. A single staff member allowed the elderly woman to walk on her own. As she was returning to her bed, she fell and hit her head on the corner of a couch. Complaining of a headache, the woman was given medication and then left unattended in her bed. The elderly woman fell asleep and never woke up. An autopsy was performed and was determined that she suffered a brain bleed and passed away as a result of falling and hitting her head. The family came to the Charles E. Boyk Law Offices for help with opening an estate and pursuing a wrongful death case against the hospital. CASE FILE

FATAL MOTORCYCLE ACCIDENT IN Toledo, ohio

Our client was a passenger on the back of her boyfriend's motorcycle, traveling northbound on East Broadway Street in Toledo, Ohio. Another driver traveling westbound on Liberty Street failed to stop at a stop sign, entering the intersection directly in our client's path of travel. The at-fault-driver was believed to be under the influence of alcohol and cocaine at the time of the accident. Tragically, our client's boyfriend died at the scene. She was taken by Life Squad to St. Vincent Hospital Emergency Department where she was treated for extensive injuries including a fractured skull, fractured back, and a fracture to her right hip and pelvis. Our client remained in the hospital for four days before being transferred to St. Charles Rehab Facility. She has undergone immeasurable pain and suffering due to her injuries and the loss of a loved one.
