Bayer Reaches Over \$10 Billion Settlement In Roundup Cancer Lawsuits

RECIPE: Brian's Pizza Soup Crowd Pleaser

August is here and with it comes the return of fall sports! Although it may look a little different this year, we can still have fun and enjoy some of our favorite tailgating treats! This pizza soup is sure to impress your family and help you get into the tailgating spirit.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 large sweet onion, finely diced
- 12-16 oz. mushrooms (baby bellas or white button mushrooms)
- 1 lb. ground Italian sausage
- 2 T minced garlic
- 2 tsp garlic powder
- 2 tsp onion powder
- 1 T oregano
- 1 T basil leaves
- 1 lb. pepperoni chunks (sliced lengthwise into quarters, then diced into .5" chunks)
- 79 oz concentrated tomato soup
- 79 oz water

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. In a large stockpot, sauté the onions for 5 minutes over medium heat until translucent but not browned. Add the mushrooms and sweat until most of the moisture is gone, about 5-7 minutes. Add the Italian sausage and cook until browned and no longer pink. Add the garlic, garlic powder, onion powder, oregano, basil, pepperoni, and minced garlic. Fry for 1-2 minutes.

- 2. Add the tomato soup concentrate and water. Bring mixture to a boil and simmer on low for 10-15 minutes until slightly thickened.
- 3. Serve with crusty bread and a sprinkle of mozzarella cheese if desired.

To Serve: Crusty bread

Chef's note: You may include anything you would norally use on pizza like banana peppers, jalapeños, garlic cloves, green peppers, olives, etc.

Avoiding Common Injuries

The most common amusement park injuries are sunburn and heat-related conditions like heat stroke and dehydration.

- Wear sunscreen
- Stay hydrated
- Review all rules and regulations on the park website before you go
- Read the signs
- Listen to your body and know your limitations

What happens if serious sickness or an injury occurs?

As a guest of an amusement park, you are a business invitee, which means the park has a duty to provide a safe environment. If something like a broken bone or a head injury happens, take immediate steps.

- Notify a park employee. Note the employee's name.
- Seek treatment at the park.
- If necessary, go to the emergency



When to call a lawyer

If a serious injury happens to your or your family, use this checklist to see if it makes sense to seek legal advice:

- Did you visit an emergency room?
- Is the injury because of something unusual, like a ride malfunction?
- Did you suffer a severe injury? (Ex: traumatic brain injury, fractures, disk ruptures, spinal cord injuries, etc.)

Family Mauled by Pit Bull

Our clients, a mother and her minor daughter, were each attacked by the same dog on two separate occasions. Our clients reside in a duplex with a No Pets Allowed policy. However, the tenant of the bottom unit keeps two pit bulls as pets.

On the day of the first attack, the little girl was at the bottom unit playing with other children. The dogs were supposed to be put away in the basement, but one of the dogs got out and violently attacked the little girl's leg. The girl was rushed to the emergency room where she stayed overnight and received thirteen stiches. The girl's mother reported the incident to the landlord.

Some time later, while the mother was outside, the same dog escaped its cage and attacked our client's legs. Our client used a full can of pepper spray on the dog, but it did not stop the dog from attacking. Police were called to the scene. As they arrived, the dog charged the responding officers, forcing them to destroy the dog.

T-Bone Collision on County Road 60 Leads to Lifelong Complications For Young Woman

Our client, a young woman in her late twenties, was traveling northbound on US 68 in Blanchard, Ohio, where the posted speed is 55 mph. As she approached an intersection, another driver traveling eastbound on SR 60 failed to yield and pulled out in front of our client.

Without time to stop, our client smashed into the side of the other vehicle. Our client's vehicle rolled three times before coming to rest off-road with the driver's side down. Our client was extracted from her vehicle by the Jaws of Life® and was then life-flighted to a nearby hospital.

Pedestrian Struck While Crossing Street Within Crosswalk

Our client was crossing the road when an individual making a left turn struck him while he was within the crosswalk. Our client was hit with such force he was knocked out of his shoes and lost consciousness.

Emergency Services came to the scene and rushed our client to the hospital. As a result of this accident, our client suffered a concussion, injuries to his neck and back, and a fracture to his left knee.

Our client underwent surgery on his knee which required placement of hardware. He is now undergoing physical therapy and faces a long road to recovery.
