Marathon Classic LPGA Golf Tournament



Serious Eye Damage Associated With Elmiron Use

Researchers have linked Elmiron, a drug used to treat intersitial cystitis, to causing a specific irreversible eye disorder called pigmentary maculopathy. As with any drug, Elmiron comes with a list of side effects. However, Elmiron's listed side effects do not include any warnings about causing vision problems. Evidence suggests that the drug's manufacturer knew about the serious link between Elmiron use and vision damage but withheld this critical information from the FDA, the medical community, and patients. In 2019, the FDA updated its Adverse Event Reporting System to include eye disorders from Elmiron use.

Our firm is currently investigating cases for people who have taken Elmiron for at least 6 months and developed macular degeneration or other eye problems.



RECIPE: Uncle Jim's Steak Tai Marinade

(for skirt steak|flat iron steak|hanger steak, it can also be used for chicken and fish)

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 C soy sauce (I used Kikoman as I think it's the best)
- 1 C rice wine vinegar
- 1/2 C brown sugar (I use Sugar In The Raw, but it doesn't dissolve as quick you'll need to keep stirring or shake it up a few times)
- 1/4 of a large sweet or red onion, diced (I use the sweet, but red works fine too)
- 1/2 bunch cilantro (rough chopped or fine chopped - but it has to be fresh!)
- 1 1/2 tsp sesame seed oil (this is optional, but it gives it a nice smell and taste - be careful, it's also bitter if you use too much)
- 2 tsp crushed red pepper (I use fresh out of a jar, but dried is OK too)

- 1 1/2 T fresh finely shredded ginger (chef's note: it's easy to grate when it's frozen... I keep mine in the freezer at all times FYI)
- 1 freshly squeezed lime

INSTRUCTIONS:

I use about 2.5-3 lbs, of steak with this much marinade with a little left over - so basically this amount can do quite a bit. Fork all of the meat and submerge it, marinate overnight (or 2-3 hours is OK) and continually pour it over the meat as you cook it. I use higher heat to try and keep the center of the steak pink and get

a blackened edge too. I have also reduced the sauce on the stove to pour over some chicken or fish/shrimp. It will get a little saltier the thicker it gets

Passenger In Critical Condition After Being Struck During Road Rage Incident

In April 2020, our 29-year-old client was operating his vehicle westbound on I-70 in Jefferson Township, Ohio. A sport utility vehicle was traveling in the same direction and after engaging in road rage activity forced our client's vehicle into a semi-truck's path of travel. The truck-driver avoided our client's vehicle by veering off the road into a grassy area. Our client and the driver of the sport utility vehicle pulled over onto the side of the road and our client exited his vehicle. As our client walked back to his car, the driver of the sport utility vehicle started driving again and struck our client, sending him flying up and over the SUV before fleeing the scene. Witnesses at the scene cared for our client while awaiting EMS to arrive. Our client was then transported to the emergency room with life threatening injuries. After two and a half months, our client remains in the hospital in a coma. The driver of the sport utility vehicle was found, and the police are investigating criminal charges.

Double Fatality Car Crash on U.S. 20Our office represents the estate of a 22-year-old

man who died in a head-on collision. The young man was traveling westbound on U.S. 20 in Richfield Township, Ohio. At the same time, an 87-year-old man was operating his vehicle eastbound on U.S. 20, behind a freightliner truck. As the elderly male attempted to pass the freightliner, he crossed left of center directly in front of our client's vehicle, hitting him head-on at a high rate of speed. Upon impact, the young man's vehicle ran off the north side of the roadway.

Emergency personnel arrived and pronounced both drivers deceased at the scene. Our office is pursuing a wrongful death claim on behalf of the young man's estate.

On The Job Injury Leads To Finger Amputation

Our client was cleaning a machine while on the job at a supply company. Another employee turned the machine on, causing our client's left hand to get sucked into the machine and crushed. Our client was taken to the on-site medical facility before being transported to the hospital. Once evaluated, he was then transferred to another hospital where he underwent emergency surgery to partially amputate his left ring finger. Our client remains off work as he heals and will undergo future therapy. Our office was retained to pursue a workers' compensation claim on our client's behalf.
